Archdiocesan Overview

Established as a diocese in 1850 and elevated to an archdiocese in 1888, the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis today serves the twelve-county greater Twin Cities metropolitan area. The Archdiocese is home to 185 parishes and 89 Catholic schools, forming one of the largest Catholic educational systems in the United States.

Education has long been central to the mission of the Church in this community. That commitment took root in 1851, when Bishop Joseph Cretin invited the Sisters of St. Joseph to lead the first girls school in Minnesota. From that original vision has grown a comprehensive network of parish, regional, and private Catholic schools serving urban, suburban, and rural communities, sustained by generations of faithful leadership, dedicated educators, and devoted benefactors.

As chief shepherd of the Archdiocese, the Archbishop bears a particular responsibility for the vitality, quality, and Catholic identity of its schools and parish catechetical programs. In partnership with pastors and school leaders, the Director of Catholic Education and Superintendent of Schools serves as the Archbishop’s principal educational leader, advancing a shared vision of excellence and ensuring that Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs remain strong, accessible, and mission-driven.

The Office for the Mission of Catholic Education is the expression of the Archbishop’s ministry as a teacher and his responsibility for Catholic education in the Archdiocese. Guided by a commitment to solidarity and subsidiarity, at the heart of his work is a deep care for maintaining the bonds of charity that unite the Christian faithful and for ensuring that the truth of the Gospel is handed on whole and integral. Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs are a key and core means of ensuring this responsibility. Under current leadership, the Archdiocese has strengthened system-wide quality and coherence in Catholic schools through shared accreditation, leadership formation, improved governance practices, and a renewed emphasis on Catholic identity. These efforts have fostered collaboration, restored trust, and positioned Catholic schools for long-term vitality amid complex demographic and educational realities.

The next Director of Catholic Education and Superintendent of Schools will encounter extraordinary commitment and expertise among pastors, heads of schools, parish catechetical leaders, staff, and volunteers, along with deep pride in the accomplishments of Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs across the Archdiocese. At the same time, the role presents important opportunities to sustain affordability, form and retain mission-aligned leaders, navigate enrollment shifts, discern growth and consolidation, advocate for school choice, and advance academic excellence, faith formation, and discipleship. The Archdiocese seeks a leader prepared to steward this moment with wisdom, courage, and a collaborative spirit, strengthening Catholic education for the good of the Church and the children and families it serves.





Excellence in Catholic Education

The following policies are designed to assist Catholic schools in providing an integrated Catholic education for their students. An integrated education means that when the educational experience at a school is taken as a whole, the Catholic school has attended to each of the essential dimensions of a child’s development outlined here in a comprehensive, ordered and unified way:

Academic Achievement and Integration

Catholic school students demonstrate mastery of a rigorous academic curriculum. The core subjects studied at each grade level emphasize skills, aptitudes and knowledge that are coherently related to one another and grounded in faith and reason. By rigorously developing their intellectual gifts, Catholic school students have a love for learning, look upon the created world with wonder and awe, and are well prepared for life.





Virtue Formation and Human Development

Catholic school students have a clear vision of human flourishing. They know how to find happiness and live as mature Christians. The supernatural strength of Christian virtue builds upon and elevates the natural human development of mind and body to make it possible for students to reach their full potential. Animated by the intellectual and moral virtues, Catholic school students are strengthened to choose to become who God has made them to be and, in doing so, fulfill the deepest desires of their hearts.

Spiritual Life

Catholic school students are growing into a mature spiritual life based upon a personal relationship with Jesus Christ whom they know and love. The relationship originates and is nourished in the sacramental and liturgical life of His Church. As love for God grows, so does a desire to reorient all of life to Him. With a strong faith, Catholic school students find in God their ultimate meaning, happiness and purpose.

Apostolic Discernment

Catholic school students understand that they are a part of the universal call to holiness and have been given unique gifts to build up the Kingdom of God. By discerning God's calling in their lives to serve Him in a particular vocation, they contribute to the good of society through holy families, the priesthood, religious life, meaningful work and good citizenship.

Parish Catechesis

Parish catechetical programs are an integral part of the educational mission of the Archdiocese. Leaders and over 3,000 volunteer catechists assist parents in forming children and young people as disciples of Jesus Christ through systematic formation, prayer, and sacramental preparation. Parishes in the Archdiocese utilize a wide variety of methods in this effort including Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, traditional classroom models and family formation. The Office for the Mission of Catholic Education provides support and leadership to parish catechetical leaders through new and ongoing leader trainings and guidance on catechetical policies, curriculum, and resources.



Position Overview

The person in this position is to articulate and promote the Vision, Mission and Purpose of the Catholic school and parish catechetical programs in the local Church. This involves building a Catholic culture that forms children and young people in the dignity of the human person; providing an integrated vision of faith and reason that responds fully to all capabilities of a person; and articulating these base principles to Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs and living these principles while providing training and resources in support of the formation of educators and other leaders. In this role, the Director of Catholic Education and Superintendent of Schools has responsibility to advance Catholic education for Catholic schools, parish catechetical programs for K–12 students, and the Archdiocese’s homeschooling communities.



Essential Duties & Responsibilities

- Lives a credible witness to Jesus Christ and the Catholic faith.
- Promotes a unified vision for Catholic education across Catholic schools, parish catechetical programs, and homeschool activities in the Archdiocese.
- Oversees and directs the strategic work of three departments: Department of Parish Catechesis, Department of Educational Quality and Excellence, and Department of Catholic Schools.
- Leads, motivates, supervises, evaluates, and supports a mission driven team.
- Implements and interprets Archdiocesan policy and regulations for Catholic education.
- Recommends to the Archbishop priorities and policies.
- Assists pastors and canonical administrators in the administration of Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs.
- Supports chaplains in their responsibilities in Catholic schools.
- Consults on the assignment of pastors, canonical administrators, chaplains, and board appointments to Catholic schools and education apostolates.
- Represents priorities and concerns of Catholic education to Offices in the Archdiocesan Catholic Center.
- Consults with Offices in the Archdiocesan Catholic Center on issues or project that fall within their competence.
- Recommends and oversees a budget for the work of the Office.

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- Develops base principles and best practices that address the value, purpose and strategies in Catholic Schools for:
 - Providing virtue formation;
 - Deepening the spiritual life of students;
 - Living Catholic social teaching;
 - Integrating of faith and reason and the rigorous study and academic excellence;
 - Proposing vocational exposure and discernment.
 - Ensures ongoing formation opportunities for administration, faculty, and others engaged in the apostolate of education.
 - Drives the Roadmap for Excellence in Catholic Education.
 - Serves as the Archbishop's delegate, as assigned, to committees, boards, funds, schools, and consultative bodies.
 - Builds community among diocesan Catholic schools offices in Minnesota (and the Dakotas).
 - Partners with community leaders to develop plans for tuition assistance, formation institutes, and other critical special projects.
 - Works in collaboration with the Minnesota Catholic Conference and other organizations to raise public awareness of the contribution Catholic education makes to parishes, communities, and society.
 - Serves as a member of the ACC senior leadership team.
 - Identifies funding priorities for Catholic education and works with Offices in the Archdiocesan Catholic Center on supporting strategy.
 - Ensures accreditation standards and jurisdictional responsibilities for Catholic schools are maintained.
 - Other duties as assigned by the Archbishop.

- Must be an active practicing Catholic with knowledge and understanding of the Roman Catholic Church, its structure and the ministries within the Offices of the Catholic Center;

- Expand collaboration with foundations, national partners, and Archdiocesan offices to leverage shared resources, strengthen financial sustainability, and advance innovation in Catholic education
