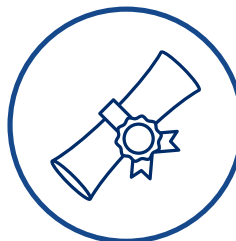

ABOUT THE URSULINE ORDER

St. Angela Merici founded the Order of St. Ursula in 1535, in Brescia, Italy. She understood the transformative power of sisterhood and the importance of education. She gathered a group of women who became leaders in the community and promoted Christian living in the home. The Ursulines spread throughout Europe and their chief work was the education of girls and young women.

The Ursulines at our school are members of the Ursulines of the Roman Union. These sisters operate 15 secondary schools in the United States, 4 colleges, and a number of elementary schools. They also minister in 36 countries on 6 continents.



ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1897, The Ursuline School is an independent, Catholic, college preparatory school for girls and young women, grades 6-12. The Ursuline School is one of a network of secondary schools and colleges of the Ursuline Sisters across the United States and 36 countries. The school is accredited by the National Association of Independent Schools, NY State Board of Regents, and is a member of the National Coalition of Girls Schools and NY State Association of Independent Schools. The campus is located 20 miles north of Manhattan in a diverse, suburban community.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Central to the school's mission is *Serviam*—"I will serve"—a call students answer through ongoing service projects that support the poor, the hungry, and the marginalized, both locally and globally, living out the values of compassion, leadership, and faith in action.



ACADEMICS

At The Ursuline School of New Rochelle, academic life is both rigorous and inspiring, rooted in a commitment to excellence and innovation. With small class sizes and a student-faculty ratio of 9:1, students benefit from personalized instruction and a supportive learning environment. Ursuline offers 17 Advanced Placement courses and a Signature Program that includes Global Education, Innovation & Design, and Science Research. The school empowers students to think critically and act compassionately, preparing them to engage with complex global issues. Through experiences such as the Global Symposium, international travel, and language immersion, Ursuline fosters a global mindset—encouraging students to become thoughtful leaders and changemakers in a rapidly evolving world.

The Ursuline School is committed to innovation and cutting-edge learning environments. Located on a 13-acre campus in New Rochelle, the school features modern classrooms, athletic facilities, and centers for the arts and sciences. Recent upgrades include two state-of-the-art facilities: the Innovation Hub, a 2,700-square-foot maker space equipped with 3D printers, robotics, laser cutters, and more; and the High-Tech Media Conference Center, a tech-rich hub for broadcasting, presentations, and collaboration. These dynamic spaces foster hands-on learning, creativity, and future-ready skills, reinforcing Ursuline's mission to prepare young women for success in college and beyond.

STUDENT LIFE

Ursuline student life supports more than 60 clubs and ensures an energetic and inclusive student experience with unique spirit-filled traditions. Opportunities for leadership, performance, global awareness, and community-building build confidence and connection. With clubs ranging from art to politics, fitness to filmmaking, and games to global issues, the extracurricular program offers a space for every personality and passion. Students are encouraged to be involved, challenge themselves, and be generous with their talents and gifts.



FINE ARTS

The Ursuline School is devoted to its strong arts program, emphasizing its commitment to nurturing students' creative talents. The school's robust offerings in dance, drama, chorus, music, media arts, and fine arts allow students to explore and develop their artistic potential fully. The Mooney Hancock Arts Center provides state-of-the-art facilities, including the 300-seat Auriana Theater, dedicated orchestra and practice rooms, a dance studio, media and broadcast centers, three fine art classrooms, and a kiln room—offering students numerous avenues for artistic expression and performance.

ATHLETICS

Athletics programs at Ursuline build confidence, strength, and leadership skills in a fun and inclusive way. The Ursuline School has a rich tradition of athletic excellence including 31 teams and 14 sports that give students a chance to thrive, lead, and grow.
