

SERVIAM

Serviam – meaning "I will serve" – is the core of Ursuline Academy's mission and is inspired by the spirit of our founder, St. Angela Merici. Serviam projects teach students to recognize needs and ultimately become changemakers in the world. Each year, they support over 50 nonprofit organizations, such as the Ronald McDonald House Charities and Special Olympics, through fundraising and charitable efforts.



GLOBAL EDUCATION & URSULINE EDUCATION NETWORK

Essential to being a leader is understanding and respecting other cultures. Through a network of over 100 Ursuline schools worldwide, students have the unique opportunity to meet and learn from our sister schools and global partnerships.

This rich international exchange program invites students to connect on virtual projects, communicate in various formats with Ursuline students from across the world, serve as a host family for visiting students, and represent Ursuline as a delegate on domestic or international exchange trips.

Ursuline offers a Global Scholars Program for students who show a particular interest in global studies. Students earn this distinction through course study and service hours related to global issues, as well as literacy projects that include reflections on the students' experiences. Colleges and universities recognize this distinction as a significant selection criterion in the admissions process.



GROWTH. VALUES. FOR LIFE.

Ursuline's student experience is built on a continuum of growth that begins with a comprehensive Freshmen Transition Series, led by the Counseling Department and Dean of Academics, to support students through social-emotional development, relationship building, and the academic skills needed for success. As students advance, they can pursue the AP Capstone Diploma, a two-course program that encourages them to think critically and creatively, conduct research, propose solutions to real-world problems, communicate effectively, collaborate, and make cross-curricular connections. Innovation is further cultivated through Ursuline's entrepreneurial focus, including the dual-enrollment EntreX curriculum with the University of Delaware's Horn Program and hands-on design thinking opportunities in the 1893 IDEA Studio. By sophomore year, all students engage in a Leadership curriculum centered on soft skills, personal branding, and a year-long leadership initiative, often leading to long-term ventures, with the option to earn one college credit through the University of Delaware's LeadX program.





FINE ARTS

Ursuline's commitment to the arts spreads the breadth of visual and performing opportunities. Our visual arts program promotes visual awareness and imaginative expression in non-verbal media. Students are exposed to traditional and contemporary techniques and concepts from Western and non-Western sources. Drawing is emphasized as a "thinking" tool to develop sophisticated observational skills. The critically essential elements and principles of art are integrated throughout all the courses. These courses cover, but are not limited to, painting, drawing, sculpture, photography, ceramics, and digital art.

If students prefer an audience, our performing arts experiences encompass various theater and music study aspects. From the staged plays and musicals to the lively performances of the chorus and ensembles, excellence is held out to students as a goal, and then the process of reaching that excellence is taught. One of the strengths of Ursuline's performing arts program lies in the notion that anyone can perform. Students take a risk each year, commit themselves to disciplined study, and enjoy the fun and camaraderie that results from working towards a shared vision.

ATHLETICS

Ursuline Academy's athletics program is steeped in over a century of tradition, dating back to the early 1900s, and is nationally recognized for its excellence._The school is deeply committed to developing well-rounded student-athletes who balance strong academic performance with competitive sports, fostering leadership, teamwork, and sportsmanship.__From the Lower School through Upper School, students have opportunities to play a wide range of sports, 13 at varsity and JV levels in high school. Ursuline's coaching staff brings experience and continuity, guiding athletes in skill development and competitive ambition, including collegiate recruitment._Their facilities are top-tier, including an on-campus gymnasium, fitness center, training room, plus off-campus fields and a track._Many Ursuline alums go on to athletic success in college, and even professionally, such as retired WNBA player and Olympian Elena Delle Donne '08. The program boasts an impressive legacy of achievements, including dozens of state championships, national honors, and individual award winners.

Strategic Leadership


- Sets the climate and culture of the Upper School; maintains a visible presence and serves as the strategic and academic leader of the Upper School.
- Fosters collegiality and team building among staff members; supports the Academy and its leaders.
- Serve as the strategic team leader for all Upper School faculty and staff, including Athletic Director, Director of College Counseling, Director of Global Education, and Coordinator of Heritage and Mission.
- Recruits and retains talented faculty and staff who will maintain the culture of excellence and achievement.
- Collaborates with faculty and staff to build a common vision for the Academy and empowers them to execute and implement that vision.
- Organizes and manages projects to achieve the goals and initiatives outlined in the strategic plan.
- Embraces and upholds the traditions of Ursuline Academy, while supporting growth, change, and academic innovation.
- Defines expectations for staff regarding instructional strategies, classroom management, and communication with the community.
- Observes employee performance, conducts staff and faculty evaluations, provides feedback, support, and advocacy.
- As a member of senior management, contributes to decisions and strategies that guide the entire school.

School Operations and Academics

- Maintains a safe, healthy environment within the Academy for students and staff.
- Coordinates adequate safety instruction and drills and assigns members of the staff to assume specified responsibilities.
- Establishes and communicates expectations for staff and students and holds the school community accountable for high-level performance.
- Oversees Academy master programs and schedules, and makes staff assignments.
- Provides instructional resources and materials to support teaching staff in accomplishing instructional goals. Consistently works to improve instruction and student achievement.
- Oversees the operations of athletics and all extra-curricular activities.
- Ensures compliance with legal requirements and government regulations.
- Ensures proper and thorough record-keeping.
- Oversees and assists in the admissions process for evaluating applicants and communicates the program value proposition to potential students and families.

Financial Management

- Develops the annual Upper School budget and ensures that spending stays within those limits.
- Communicates with faculty regarding ongoing resources needed to implement innovative academic programming.
- Presents the need for additional equipment and supplies to the President, the Advancement office, or the Finance office.



External Relations

- Develops an open line of communication with parents and works in partnership with them.
- Has a positive attitude with children, parents, and colleagues.
- Attends and participates in all major fundraisers and social events of the Upper School.
- Maintains a rapport with the Diocese of Wilmington.

- Maintains confidentiality at all times regarding the Ursuline community.
- Attends all required meetings and is willing to perform all other duties as assigned.
- Contributes by personal example to an atmosphere of faith commitment in a manner consistent with Catholic values and the foundress, St. Angela Merici.

PROFESSIONAL & PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS


